Rector's Message

Dear Saints of James,

I am thinking about prayer, patience and speed. At a recent gathering of the Sudanese Christian Fellowship Sunday evening prayer service, I was engaged in a conversation about prayer with a mother of three young children. We were talking about prayer and how we need to be persistent in our conversation with God. If a prayer request does not seem to be answered right away, then we may conclude that God is not concerned, or caring about us, or maybe is indifferent. One of my favorite authors, Frederick Buechner says this about prayer: "According to Jesus, by far the most important thing about praying is to keep at it...He says God is like a friend you go to borrow bread from at midnight. The friend tells you in effect to drop dead, but you go on knocking anyway until finally he gives you what you want so he can go back to bed again (Luke 11:5-8). Or God is like a crooked judge who refuses to hear the case of a certain poor widow, presumably because he knows there's nothing much in it for him. But she keeps on hounding him until finally he hears her case just to get her out of his hair (Luke 18:1-8). *Beyond Words*. Along with persistence, we need patience. God's time is not usually our time, and so we must practice the spiritual discipline of patience.

Waiting has become almost uncivilized in this era of hyper-speed. How many times have you stood in a line and almost burst a blood vessel fuming over some minor inconvenience? Blowups with family members at home, honking horns in traffic jams, angry confrontations in public places, the stampede to get off airplanes, the cursing at automated message systems, the lack of etiquette everywhere — all of these and many other societal problems can be traced back to impatience.

"Conquer haste", the Zen masters say. The writer Joe Hyams, author of *Zen in the Martial Arts*, describes how he learned that lesson in a meeting with the master Bong Soo Han. The two were having tea when a letter arrived from the teacher's family in Korea. Hyams says: "Knowing he had been eagerly anticipating the letter, I paused in our conversation, expecting him to tear open the envelope and hastily scan the contents. Instead, he put the letter aside, turned to me, and continued our conversation. The following day I remarked on his self-control, saying that I would have read the letter at once. "I did what I would have done had I been alone," he said. "I put the letter aside until I had conquered haste. Then when I set my hand to it, I opened it as though it were something precious." I puzzled over this comment a moment, knowing he meant it as a lesson for me.

Finally I said I didn't understand what such patience led to. "It leads to this," he said. "Those who are patient in the trivial things in life have the same mastery in great and important things."

The discipline of patience is hard to master in our culture of speed. It has taken over our modern world: speed of production, speed of innovation, speed of investment, speed in the pace of life and the movement of images, speed in communication. God must have a wonderful sense of humor, for we have many opportunities to practice patience in our lives. This begins with the acceptance that we are not in control of the timetable, or the outcome. Accepting this truth is not easy, especially if we or our loved ones are experiencing difficulties or suffering physically or emotionally. We long to have an instant resolution and a speedy answer to our prayers. There is no way to push the river or hasten the harvest. Instead, spiritual maturity comes through diligence, persistence, and patiently waiting on God's grace.

In our instant culture, may you practice prayer with patience and through this, experience the peace of God.

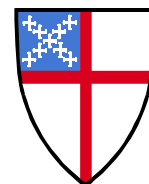
